Parent Teleconferences Overview

The aim of the Parent Teleconferences is to: 1) help parents gain effectiveness and familiarity with TLC System of Treatment; and 2) develop a healthy parent and child relationship.

To accomplish this, parents and staff must team together consistently and communicate openly for the benefit of their children and family. Parents will learn TLC's Fidelity of Treatment philosophy and goals, be conversant in the TLC "Lexicon", use of the TLC Point Sheet and Flow Chart, and active participation in role-playing (with video feedback) to resolve interaction and communication problems.
